Place: vocational school

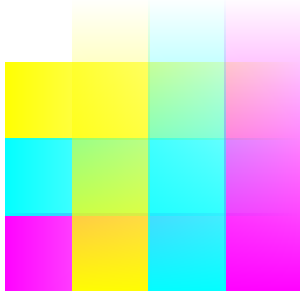
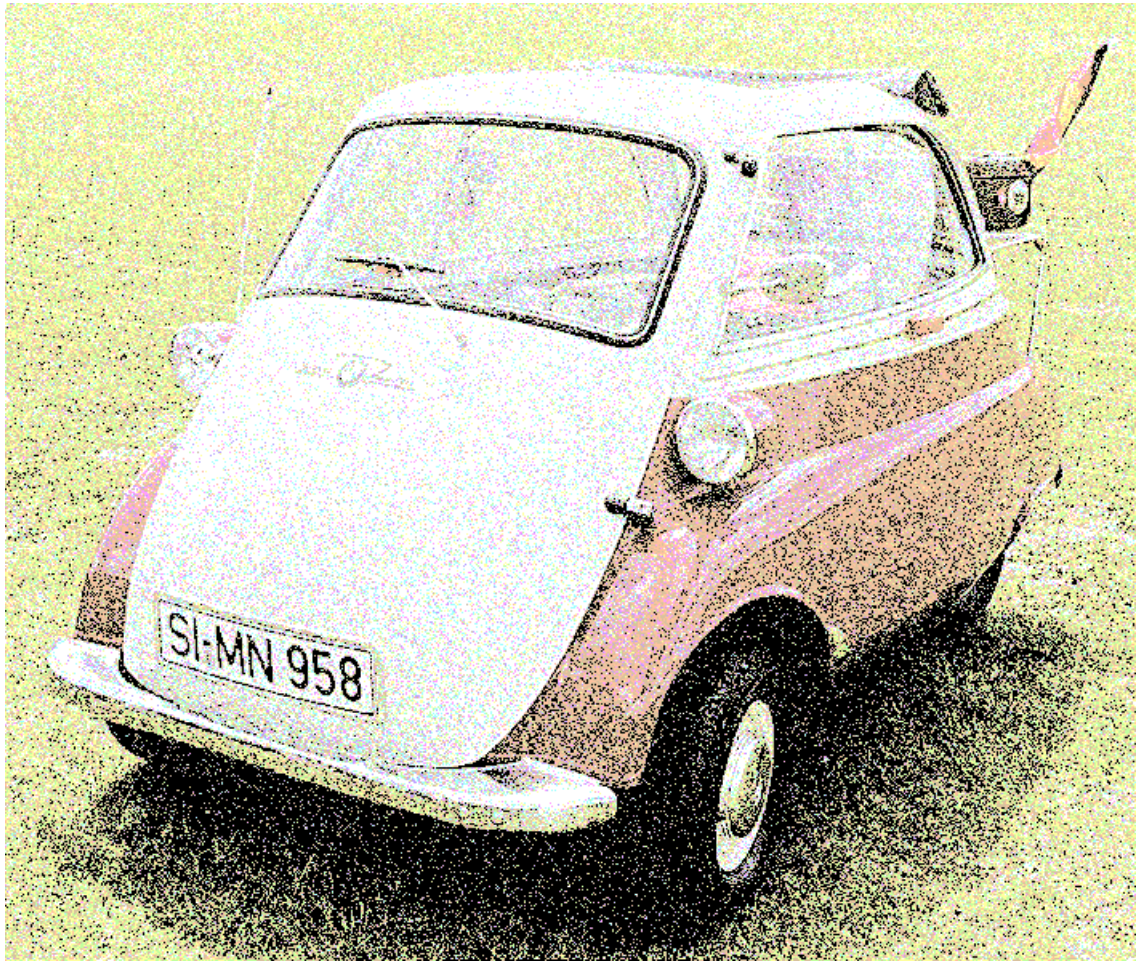
The kiddies are eager to print shirts, pictures from facebook,etc.

This works fine for one color jobs.

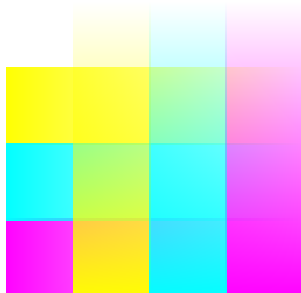
So I try to do multi color jobs. The result are interesting but I think that there is a lot of work to get this method predictable.

Maybe it is something for beginners or artist.

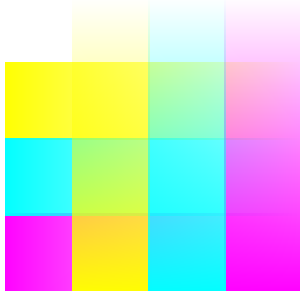


all colors: cyan/magenta/yellow/black, transparency set to 35%

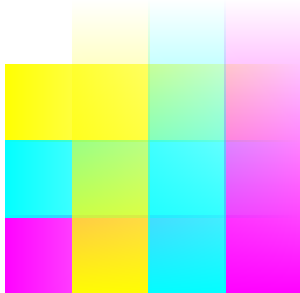




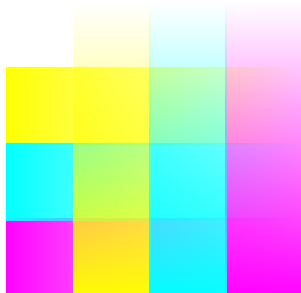
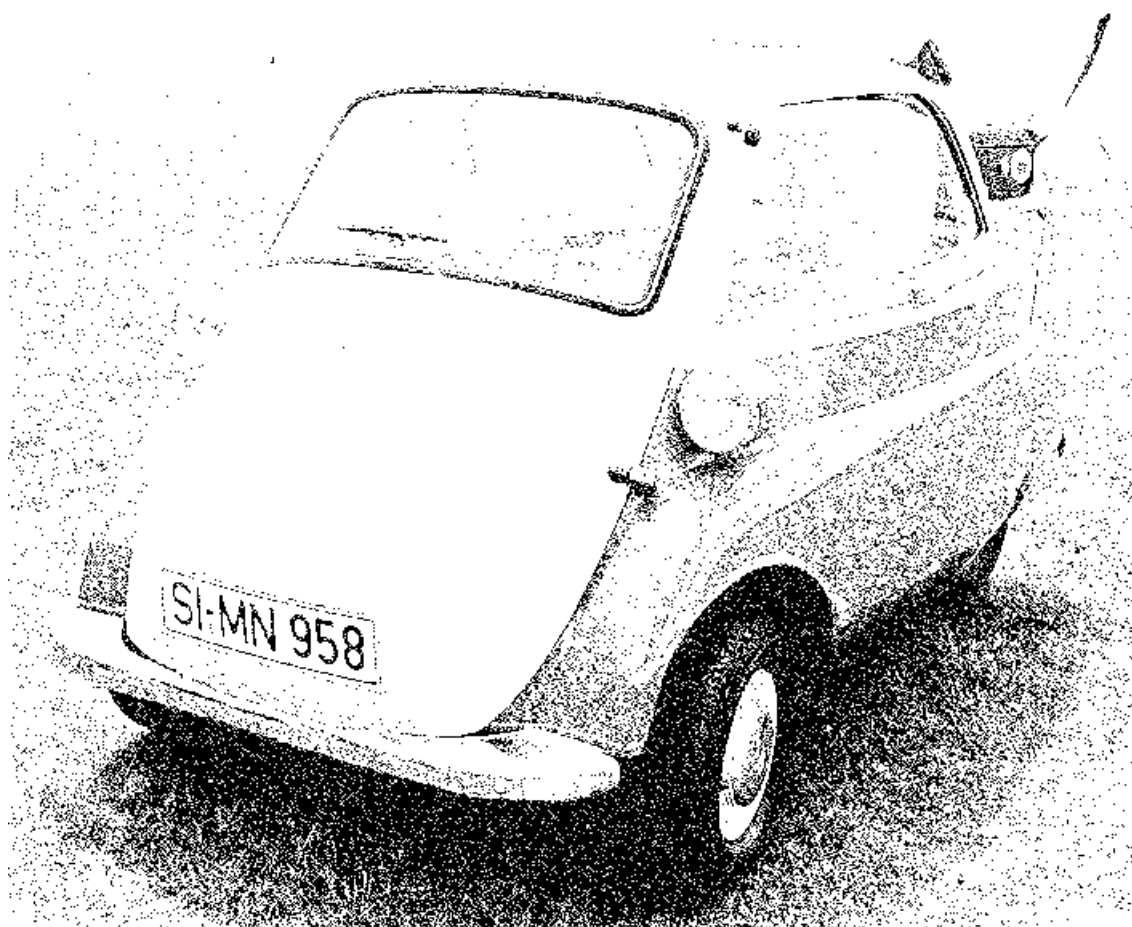
magenta separation, no transparency
